

# Seminars for Higher Education Administrators

Through its short-term seminars, the Fulbright Scholar Program can help U.S. administrators establish lasting connections within the societal, cultural and higher education systems of other countries.

Selected administrators return with an enhanced ability to serve international students and to encourage study-abroad students. Grantees also gain a broadened perspective of U.S. and international higher education and typically develop lasting contacts abroad.

## **International Education Administrators Program (GERMANY)**

- 25 grants available for two weeks in late October 2011
- Open to experienced international exchange staff, foreign admissions advisors, study-abroad staff, international education exchange advisors, career services, alumni affairs and development/fundraising staff.
- Ph.D. is not required for this award
- Application Deadline: February 1, 2011

## **International Education Administrators Program (JAPAN)**

- Five grants available for three weeks beginning in June 2011
- Open to international education administrators as well as senior administrators with significant responsibilities for international programs and activities on campuses, and applicants from some nonprofits.
- Applicants from U.S. institutions must have at least 25 Japanese students on home campus
- Ph.D. is not required for this award
- Application Deadline: November 1, 2010

## **International Education Administrators Program (INDIA)**

- 12 grants are available for two weeks beginning in March 2011
- Open to experienced international education exchange, foreign admissions advising, and study-abroad staff. This award is designed for senior-level administrators responsible for enhancing the international dimensions of their institutions.
- Ph.D. is not required for this award
- Application Deadline: August 2, 2010

## **International Education Administrators Program (KOREA)**

- Eight grants available for two weeks beginning in mid-June 2011
- Open to international education administrators and other senior administrators with significant responsibilities for international programs and activities. Applicants based at some nonprofits are also welcome to apply.
- Ph.D. is not required for this award
- Application Deadline: November 1, 2010
