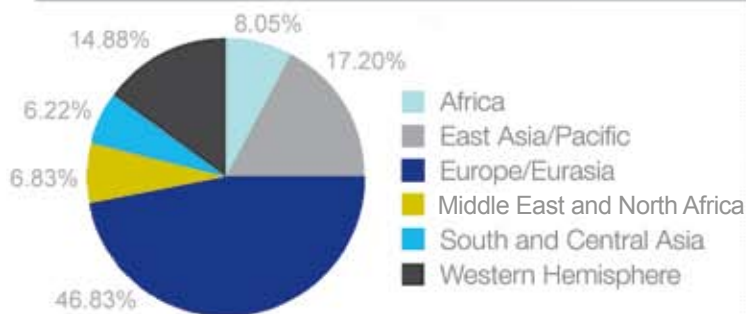
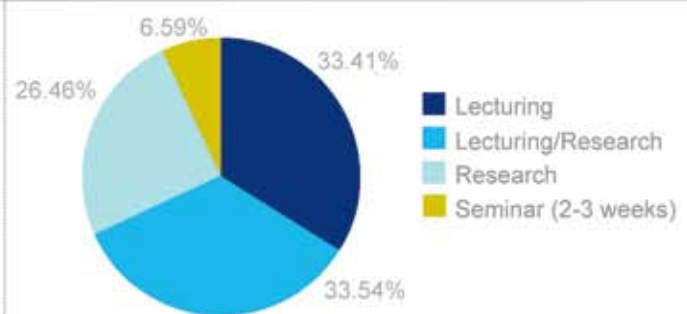


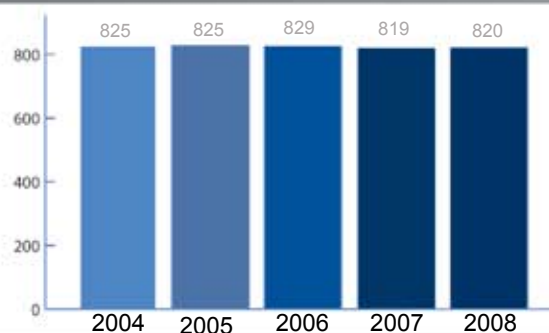
U.S. Scholar Grants by World Region

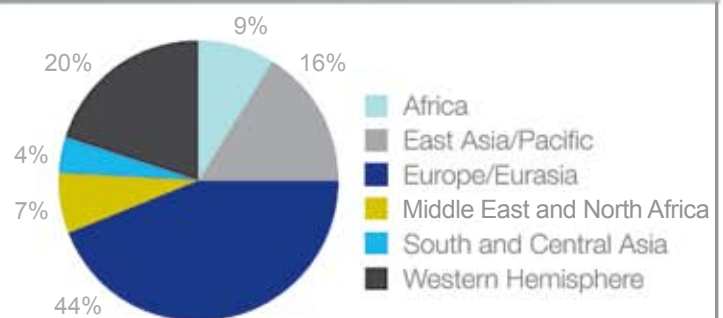

U.S. Fulbright Specialist Grantees by World Region



- The traditional Fulbright U.S. Scholar Program, established in 1946, sends more than 800 U.S. faculty and professionals each year to lecture or research in other countries. Grants typically last from two months to a full academic year, and are available in more than 130 countries.
- Grantees come from more than 500 colleges and universities and public and private agencies in all 50 states, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico and the U.S. Virgin Islands.
- Fulbright grantees include scholars with international reputations; community college faculty; adjunct and retired faculty; academic administrators; independent scholars; artists, lawyers, journalists, research scientists and other professionals.
- Scholars from different ethnic backgrounds participate in the Fulbright Scholar Program in approximately the same proportions as they are represented in American academe. In 2008-09, 6.9% of U.S. Fulbright Scholars who completed the

voluntary race/ethnicity survey identified themselves as African-American, and 8.1% identified themselves as Hispanic.

- The gender breakdown for 2008-09 U.S. Fulbright Scholars is 59% male and 41% female.
- A recent addition to Fulbright Scholar Programs, the **Fulbright Specialists Program** provides short-term academic opportunities for US scholars. Grants last from two to six weeks, and allow grantees to mentor faculty or develop curriculum, or to lecture. This program has nearly tripled in size since its introduction. In 2008, more than 300 grants were awarded for activities in nearly 100 countries.
- Other programs offering a range of activities as part of Fulbright Scholar Programs are the **Distinguished Chairs Program**, **New Century Scholars** and the **International Education Administrators Seminars** in Germany, Japan and Korea.
