Tips for Taking Photos of Your Fulbright Scholar Experience

Describe your Fulbright Scholar experience through action photos.

- Take photos that clearly convey your project. If you were on a research grant, take photos of how you collected data.
- Take photos showing your interaction with colleagues, students, and other community members. You should be included in at least some of the photos.
- Take photos of your work both inside the classroom and outside of the classroom.

Take a variety of different shots.

- Get a good mix of action, posed and candid shots.
- Take both vertical and horizontal photos.
- Take photos that focus on the people and community, as well as photos that focus on the scenery and community.

Take high resolution photos appropriate for printing.

- Digital photos should be set at high and photo size should be at least 4" X 6".
- Scan photo prints at a resolution of at least 300 dpi.

Send files as individual photo files.

- Photos should be saved as .jpg, .tiff, .eps or .bmp.
- Do not save photos as inserted pictures in PDFs, Word documents, PowerPoint presentations, etc.

Please include caption information for each of your photos.

- Names and titles of individuals in the photo
- Time and location that the photo was taken
- Photographer's name if attribution is necessary
