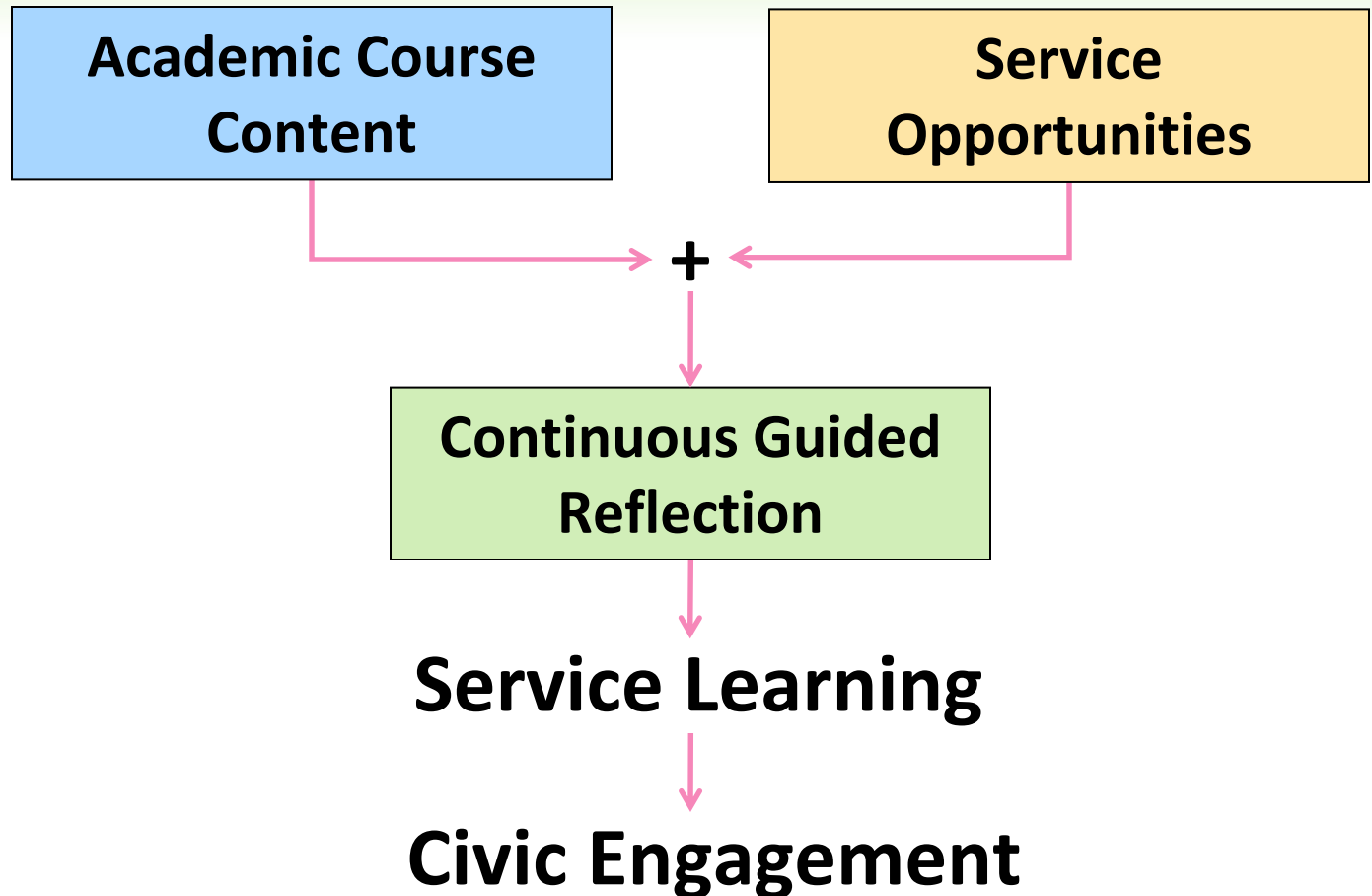

Spring 2009 Survey Results (162 students)

- ◎ **91%** of students – Plan to **perform community service** in the future.

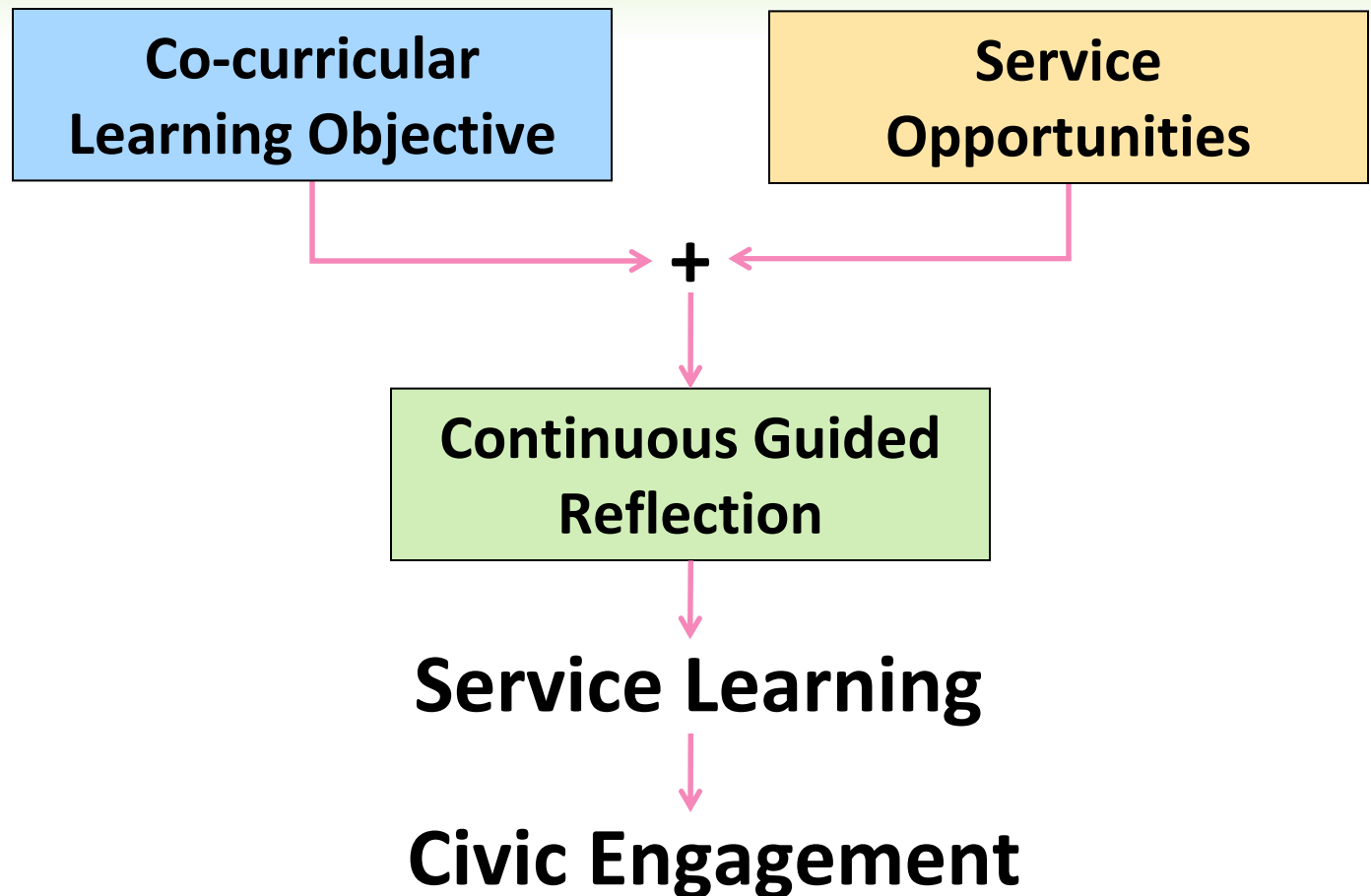
