The Fulbright Program



- Established 1946 to expand and strengthen the relationships between the people of the United States and citizens of the rest of the world
- Sponsored by U.S. Department of State's Bureau of Educational and Cultural Affairs and administered by the Institute of International Education's Council for International Exchange of Scholars (CIES)

Eligibility for U.S. Scholar Programs

- U.S. citizenship
- Degree as required by award
 - Ph.D. or other terminal degree may be required
 - Many awards are open to applicants with a Masters and professional or academic experience
- Open to professionals and artists outside academia with recognized standing and substantial accomplishments
- Teaching experience as required by award
- New policies on previous Fulbright Scholar grants and waiting periods between grants



Fulbright NATO Excellence Award

- Opportunity to serve as a “technical specialist” at NATO’s Strategic Communications Centre of Excellence in Riga, Latvia
 - Conduct research on disinformation in social media
 - Researcher will be placed in the Technical and Scientific Development Branch (TSDB)

- Nine to 12 months
 - Commence anytime between January and September 2019
- Work will be undertaken in English

Fulbright NATO Excellence Award

- Applicants should not contact NATO CoE to organize or advocate for a placement
- Qualifications:
 - Graduate degree in Anthropology, Computer Science, Political Science, Psychology, or Sociology
 - Professionals/non-academics with a minimum experience of five years in the field will be considered
 - Desired:*
 - Experience in the field of communication
 - Natural Language Processing
 - Language skills in Arabic or Russian

Deadline to apply is October 15, 2018, 11:59 pm PST

- Suitability of the applicant
- Quality of the project
- Potential impact
- Record of service to the field
- Ability to serve as an unofficial cultural ambassador
- Foreign language proficiency
- Previous Experience Abroad
- Previous Fulbright Awards
- Veterans of Military Service
