Host a Visiting Scholar

- The Fulbright Outreach Lecturing Fund provides funding for Fulbright Visiting Scholars who are already in the United States to travel to host institutions for short-term speaking engagements.

- The Fulbright Scholar-In-Residence Program provides grants for Visiting Scholars to teach, for a semester or academic year at institutions that might not have a strong international component.

- Priority consideration in both programs will be given to campuses that serve student populations that are traditionally underrepresented in international exchange, such as minority serving institutions, community colleges, and small, liberal arts colleges.
