

Fulbright Scholar Alumni Ambassador FAQs

Question: Who are Fulbright Scholar Alumni Ambassadors?

Answer: Fulbright Scholar Alumni Ambassadors are a select group of Fulbright Scholar alumni who are trained to serve as representatives for the Fulbright Scholar Program at campus presentations and academic conferences across the United States. These scholars serve two-year terms and present information on their Fulbright experience at multiple outreach events each year. Only alumni of the Fulbright U.S. Scholar Programs can participate in this opportunity.

Question: How are Fulbright Scholar Alumni Ambassadors selected?

Answer: Fulbright Scholar Alumni Ambassadors are nominated from Fulbright Scholar Program alumni who have successfully completed at least three years of service as regional peer reviewers for the Fulbright Scholar Program. The final individuals are selected from the full spectrum of U.S. academic disciplines, higher education institutions, and geographic regions. If you're interested in serving as a Fulbright Scholar Alumni Ambassador, the first step would be serving for three years as a peer review committee member. Question: What events do Fulbright Scholar Alumni Ambassadors participate in, and what information do they typically present?

Answer: Fulbright Scholar Alumni Ambassadors are trained to serve as representatives for the Fulbright Scholar Program at campus presentations and academic conferences across the United States. During their workshops, Fulbright Scholar Alumni Ambassadors discuss their individual Fulbright experience, with a focus on the impact of their grant on their career, home institution, and community. These events are a fantastic opportunity to learn more about the Fulbright Scholar Program, directly from an alumnus.

Question: How long is a Fulbright Scholar Alumni Ambassador presentation?

Answer: Typically, Fulbright Scholar Alumni Ambassador presentations are 45-minutes to 1 hour in length. Following the presentation, ambassadors allot 15-30 minutes for questions from the audience. When participating in conferences, ambassador presentation lengths vary depending on the type of session and audience.
