Why I Chose to Apply

- **To Connect:** Both Fulbright opportunities allowed me to connect with colleagues, students, and acquaintances who had unique historical and social perspectives that enlarged my thinking, my teaching, and my outlook on the world.






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Personal Impact

Productive Disorientation: In part due to language issues and in part due to location, my Fulbright experiences deepened ability to be in the present, attentive and open. Moments of closedness became opportunities for personal insight.

Alternative Living: Although some aspects of my life stayed the same, I took these months as moment to try living differently, especially with respect to time.

Outward Inclination: These experiences reinforced my convictions about the 'good' that comes through international exchanges, and they've motivated me to encourage and support others' interests in pursuing such exchanges.







Professional Impact


- **Productive Disorientation:** My grant opportunities were tremendously formative. I went at two key moments in my career, and these experiences profoundly re-shaped my teaching and research.
